HISTORIAN'S REPORT



Early in October, this writer attended a public auction for the express purpose of purchasing an item or two from the estate of the late Somers Corson. Accompanied by our society president, successful bids were made on a grub hoe and a redware milk pan. We felt it important to acquire pieces belonging to Somers as a memento honoring his love and knowledge of Cape May County history. Somers will always be remembered with affection and respect as a long-time member of the Historical Preservation Society of Upper Township.

Also purchased at the sale was a New Jersey map dated 1876 which shows every railroad throughout the state at that time. It will be on display at the Tuckahoe Junction Railroad Station, and the Corson pieces at the Gandy Farmstead.

The c. 1830 Friendship School is now home to the Beesley's Point Farmer's School House bell. John Del Corio and Betty Del Corio have generously donated the bell, along with a brief history of the school and its chain of ownership. Additional deed records in copy form have been provided by Laurie Thomas, researcher at the Cape May County Clerk's office.

We are pleased that all of these objects are now a part of our ever-growing collection.

One more thing! When you visit or drive by the Gandy House, please take note of the new candle window lights. Each electric light is securely anchored on the window sill by a fluted aged tin base. All eight windows are illuminated.



- In spite of the less than perfect weather October's **AppleFest** was also successful. Check the color attachments for pictures of both events.




- 10 – **NJ State History Fair** at Washington Crossing State Park, Titusville, observing both the Fair's 10th Anniversary and New Jersey's 350th.
